BUG REPORT
Version 1.0 of TFBD is not a final version yet (far from it) nor even perfectly finished. It still contains some imperfections and misses, which are not necessarily bugs. They are indicated here so that you are not surprized if you encounter them.
I - Absence of bugs
TFBD never has me: - Destroyed a partition or a directory, - Damaged a file, - Blocked the keyboard or the machine nor erased a block 0. And there is no reason so that it does that to you. I think that this kind of thing is good to indicate.
II - Presence of bugs
- OBJ files are at the moment only very partially managed; some OMF records are ignored (using,

- align). It's the same with LIB files which are handled as OBJ files.
- Some deletions of constants can provoke rather exotic effects at the level of the listing (bad realignments). TC mostly solves the problem (see TC in the manual).
- The generator of labels (GENLAB) can in certain (rare) cases not generate labels that it should generate (conflict with other existing labels, after a first generation). Generally, MATCH L and/or TC corrects the matter, but imperfections can remain. It is necessary to manually remove certain labels (see GENLAB, MATCH, LAB and REM in the manual).

Voila. This is not big deal but that allows to avoid you having to push some opened doors by coming to say to me that you discovered that But if you have the opportunity there, do not hesitate.
And in case of crash (I had none since quite a lot of time, but that can come in the next minute), do not forget that QuitCDA allows TFBD to create a backup of what was made (refer to the manual).
